

November 1-7 – PRAISE & THANKSGIVING	
Week 1	<i>All this is for your benefit, so that the grace that is reaching more and more people may cause thanksgiving to overflow to the glory of God. 2 Corinthians 4:15</i>
Fri 1	<b>Praise GOD</b> for TJN and their work with the underground church in their community. Their Thanksgiving services were overflowing as Urdu speakers from Pakistan, Arabic speakers from Syria, Farsi and Pashto speakers from Afghanistan and Iran and even some English speakers piled in to hear about Jesus! Lift the TJN team in prayer as well as those who they are currently discipling.
Sat 2	<b>Praise GOD</b> for long-term workers who are discipling MBBs, helping them start a Bible study group with their families and friends. K and daughter A found true peace in Jesus and the power to forgive relatives who hurt them. They are now going from one relative's home to another bringing Christ's message of reconciliation.
Sun 3	<b>Praise GOD</b> for every man and woman in Indonesia who had found Jesus to be the pearl of great value. Pray that their valuing and treasuring of Jesus would lead many others to enter His Kingdom. Pray for protection!
Mon 4	<b>Praise GOD</b> for this recent development broadcasted in Fox News: "What if I told you the mosques are empty inside Iran? What if I told you no one follows Islam inside of Iran? Would you believe me? This is exactly what is happening inside of Iran. God is moving powerfully inside of Iran." Continue to lift Iran in prayer!
Tue 5	<b>Praise GOD</b> for how He is using FEBC Malawi to reach out to the Yao Muslims across the country, as well as in neighbouring Tanzania and Mozambique. D, a local pastor in Tanzania, shared how the programs have opened the minds of many Yao Muslims living near his church. Pray for the expansion of the shortwave broadcasts so many more Muslims would be open to hear the Gospel and tune in.
Wed-Thu 6-7	<b>Praise GOD</b> for the almost 3,500 Turkish NTs that arrived safely. According to the workers, they have waited for the Bibles for many many years! Pray for the government officials that the workers have reached out to so they are able to receive the Bibles without problems. Pray for the public dedication ceremony for the Bibles scheduled on November 25 <sup>th</sup> and for the officials that expressed interest to be at the event!
November 8-14 – PRAY FOR MUSLIM PEOPLE	
Week 2	<i>I revealed myself to those who did not ask for me; I was found by those who did not seek me. To a nation that did not call on my name, I said, 'Here am I, here am I.' Isaiah 65:1</i>
Fri 8	Last Tuesday, bombs shattered the peace in Qamishli, a city in northern Syria. A pastor of the Alliance Church in Qamishli went out to estimate the damage and set out to help. <b>Pray</b> for the Christian family whose house was hit by two missiles. The father was injured and lost his shop and house and his wife is in critical state.
Sat 9	<b>Pray</b> for Central Asian young people who access the internet in today's digital world. Ask that they will search for truth and find it online. Pray that gospel outreach efforts using social media will have a broad reach.
Sun 10	The Sokoto Fulani are a sub-group of the much larger Fulani tribe which is spread across much of West Africa. Muslim family leaders view Christianity as a threat to their way of life and believers are scared to declare their faith openly. <b>Pray</b> that God raise believers who are skilled in drilling water or providing medical care. They could make positive contact with the leaders, who in turn, can open the gospel to be shared.
Mon 11	<b>Pray</b> for Turkey, starting with Istanbul, the economic, industrial, educational, religious center of the Turkish world. Pray that there will be transformation from within. This homeland of so much of the early church – that is now 99% Muslim – can once again be a beacon of light and hope to the world. It is possible!
Tue 12	The Nubians consist of seven non-Arab Muslim tribes which originated in the Nubia region, an area that straddles southern Egypt and northern Sudan. Fear that Christianity undermines their identity and traditions prevents many from accepting Jesus. <b>Pray</b> for believers to build bridges of friendship with Nubian families.
Wed-Thu 13-14	The Soninke live along the Senegal River and the western border of Mali. Most men are doing migrant work, which often lasts from 2-4 years. Believers can reach the men while they are in migrant camps. The JESUS Film and Global Recording Network materials can be useful. <b>Pray</b> for boldness and courage for the few believers!

November 15-21 – PRAY FOR THE CHURCH AND THE LABOURERS	
Week 3	<i>The Lord replied, "Don't say, 'I'm too young,' for you must go wherever I send you and say whatever I tell you. And don't be afraid of the people, for I will be with you and will protect you. I, the Lord, have spoken!"</i> Jeremiah 1:7-8
Fri 15	<b>Pray</b> for Brother A and his family. He is a Muslim-background believer and leads a small church in the state of Kerala, India. Pray that he will grow in intimacy with the Lord and commit more and more to making him known. Lift up in prayer the Mappila Muslims of India that he is reaching out to.
Sat 16	<b>Pray</b> for nine men of the "Church of Iran" denomination who have each received a five-year prison sentence due to their Christian faith and activity. The sentences are being appealed. Pray that the appeal will be successful and the sentences overturned.
Sun 17	New believers in Chad have been meeting to pray and study God's Word, and they see that God is working. One of the leaders, H, needs more people to help him share the leadership load. <b>Pray</b> for God to provide in this way. Pray too for these groups to grow in maturity in their new found faith.
Mon 18	Workers in the Middle East are hosting fifty Syrian church leaders for a conference to encourage them in developing and maintaining healthy churches. <b>Pray</b> all would arrive safely. Pray that leaders would take away something to help their churches in Syria and for key partnerships to further initiatives inside Syria.
Tue 19	"I learned about Mrs. G from someone who grew up in Jamaica." A journey through the Bible with Mrs. G is a Bible school study, excellent in every way. <b>Pray</b> for the Arabic, Spanish and Mandarin translation and production Transworld Radio teams as they translate and produce children's Bible stories in Canada.
Wed-Thu 20-21	An imprisoned Iranian pastor, ended his three-week hunger strike in Evin Prison, where he is serving a 10-year sentence. The strike came in response to a ruling that is keeping his two sons from completing their schooling but has decided to end it due to the significant attention he is getting. Uphold him and his sons in prayer!
November 22-30 – PRAY FOR A MUSLIM REGION/ UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUP	
Week 4	<i>Nine rooms in the House of Islam: West Africa</i>
Fri 22	The Hausa also known as the custodians of Islam in West Africa number around 48.2 million. More than a million Hausa (3%) are Christian. <b>Pray</b> for Hausas to open their homes and hearts to Christ followers and for local and global believers to hear and obey God's call to reach the Hausa.
Sat 23	The Kanuri in Nigeria number around 10 million with less than 0.1% believers. Nigerian believers of other tribes may be able to communicate the Gospel message accurately and well to the Kanuri. <b>Pray</b> for Kanuri believers to become effective and fruitful in sowing God's Word among their own families and communities.
Sun 24	The Wolof are a large ethnic group with a population of 6 million located in the West African countries of Senegal and Gambia. <b>Pray</b> for spiritual breakthroughs among the Muslim majority and for the small body of believers to boldly live out their faith in a way that draws Muslims to Christ.
Mon 25	The Bambara are among the most powerful and influential groups in Mali numbering around 5.8 million. However, Mali is one of the poorest countries in the world and many suffer from poverty. Despite this, the church, though still small, has taken root in the cultures and hearts of the Malian people. <b>Pray</b> that the Holy Spirit will complete the work begun in the hearts of the Bambara believers through adequate discipleship.
Tue-Wed 26-27	The Malinke-Jula people cluster number around 4.8 million and are scattered in Burkina Faso, Cote d'Ivoire, Ghana and Mali. <b>Pray</b> for the Bible translation work still being done. Pray for faithful workers who will start schools and orphanages. Pray that God will protect the mission work being done among the Malinke peoples.
Thu-Sat 28-30	The Moors in Mauritania are very protective of their Islam heritage. Numbering around 3.7 million with less than 0.1% Christians, the Black Moors and the nomads are among the hardest to reach with the Gospel. <b>Pray</b> for the Word of God to be preached among Mauritania in their heart language. Pray for Christ's freedom to be understood by those suffering under the bondage of slavery.
